Not losing Hope in the Aftermath of the Storms



"It was 6 am on September 2nd, 2008 in Haiti, and rushing water had surrounded the **Hope for Haiti** house at almost four feet in depth in only two hours. We had never seen water rise to such a high level so quickly! It came without warning, without chance for preparation.

As the water receded, it unveiled the destruction left behind. Thousands of homes destroyed, animals and crops washed away, and human lives lost. People were stranded on rooftops, scared and desperate.

Can you imagine bearing witness to such devastation, realizing that there was no help on the way? It was a feeling of such isolation and helplessness that, as Americans, we had never experienced before," explained Tiffany, our Program Director, as she described her experience after Hurricane Hannah.

Immediate problems require solutions. Hope for Haiti staff combed the town of Les Cayes, searching for supplies. Toothbrushes, toothpaste, water purification tablets, antibacterial soap, laundry detergent, candles, matches, along with Kids Against Hunger of S.W. Florida meal packets, were all collected and repackaged as emergency survival buckets. The survival buckets were distributed through churches and schools, throughout Les Cayes to families in the greatest need.

For the past 20 years Hope for Haiti has remained resolute in our mission. But that incessant string of hurricanes has caused Hope for Haiti to embark on a new responsibility to the community. Hope for Haiti will be implementing strategies for hurricane season precaution, reaction and response. The next time Mother Nature decides to pull the rug out from underneath our Haitian neighbors, Hope for Haiti will be ready.

Who We Help



- Kidney Cleger

This spring **Hope for Hait** celebrates the successful surgery and recovery of beautiful baby girl, Kidney Clerger. She was born on December 13, 2007 to Sandra, who noticed that Kidney had bands around her left wrist and left ankle. Her left fingers were all stuck together as well and a bit malformed. Kidney was born with amniotic band syndrome, a congenital disorder that results in constricting rings around extremities. Sandra arrived at the Missionaries of Charity in Les Cayes to seek help for her little girl, whose left foot was extremely enlarged, in pain, and unable to walk. **Hope for Hait** worked to find the right medical attention quickly. The overall consensus from medical

opinions, domestic and abroad, was amputation and any delay could lead to infection and death in a child so young. Hope for Haiti wanted to be sure that there was no other option for surgery that could save Kidney's foot. With the help

of Caribbean Children's Foundation (CCF) and Hospital Cite Lumiere, Dr. William Ten Haaf "Dr. Bill" answered our call.

After having a consultation with Kidney, Dr. Bill explained that he would leave amputation of the foot as the last possible option and would perform a surgical procedure to increase blood flow to Kidney's limb immediately. After a successful surgery and two weeks of recovery, Kidney is happy and able to walk! Kidney's procedure cost \$350, a small price to pay to save this beautiful girls life. Without **Hope for Haiti**'s medical support and connections, Sandra would have had no resources to help her daughter. To Sandra and Kidney, **Hope for Haiti**'s help is absolutely priceless.





- Making Dreams Come True!

This February, **Hope for Haiti** installed three more solar powered Ultra-Violet (UV) water purification systems providing 500 gallons of 99.99% purified drinking water to schools, clinics, and communities each day.

One new system was installed for Father Luc Jolicoeur's mission of Little Brothers of the Good Shepard. He started an orphanage in 1991 which has grown to care for over 160 boys and, with **Hope for Haiti**'s help, has established a primary and scondary school which educates over 600 students.

Father Luc, now 70 years old, explained that his next dream was to have clean drinking water. With no means of purification, the people were all too often getting sick from drinking the city water when it was available. **Hope for Haiti** answered that dream.Today, Father Luc, his children, and the community rejoice in having purified drinking water available to them each day.

Last December, Venia Izaak, 17 years old, was unresponsive from severe malnutrition that left her unable to walk, talk, or even lift her head. The severity of malnutrition had made her age unidentifiable, with only her eyes and her teeth providing hints of her body's development. Her legs and arms had begun to show signs of Kwashiorkor, a disorder caused by extreme protein deficiency. In desperation, her mother, Dieula, carried Venia over 2 hours from the mountains to one of **Hope for Hait**'s supported medical nutrition centers, Ti Moun Kontan

"Happy Children" of Aquin.

The Sisters of Franciscan Missionaries of Our Lady, who oversee the nutrition center, were dedicated to doing everything possible to save this child's life. Today,

we are happy to report that Venia is well on her way to recovery. She is walking, smiling, and playing. Sadly, Venia



will never recover her full physical growth that has been severely impeded from years of malnutrition and extreme poverty. Thankfully, Venia is a living survivor who reminds us every day how vital nutrition is to development and the over all wellbeing of a nation.



- Expansion of Health and Hope

With the generous support of Dan and Beth Hughes, Hope for Haiti is expanding it's healthcare outreach to better serve the basic medical needs of the poorest of the poor in Les Cayes and the surrounding areas. Renovations have been completed on the Hope for Haiti Dispensary and will open in April. This new healthcare facility is dedicated in memory of Charles J. Hughes and will be the home base for all of Hope for Haiti's healthcare projects and collaborations.

Just last year, Hope for Haiti provided over \$15 million worth of humanitarian aid to Haiti, the majority of which were medications and medical supplies that benefited over 20 healthcare centers. These medications

and supplies improved the quality of lives for over 350,000 men, women, and children. **Hope for Haiti** is dedicated to helping provide access and quality of healthcare to the Haitian people in the greatest need.

Team members had an experience that was both emotionally and physically challenging, maximizing their short visit to provide the most love and care to as many men, women, and children possible. Team members cared for emaciated and sick children, forgotten elderly in nursing homes, discarded

handicapped children and adults, while also assembling survival buckets, unpacking medications, and distributing supplies to **Hope for Haiti** programs. In only six days, these friends of **Hope for Haiti** had the opportunity to experience the lives of the Haitian people and to better understand the work and impact of **Hope for Haiti**, an organization that they have supported for years. The mission ended with a very memorable experience for all. The team accompanied 30 handicapped children to the beach to swim in the water and play in the sand, something these children never have the chance to do. The team brought inner tubes from the States in preparation and

spent the week blowing them up individually. The day was full of fun, happiness, and absolute joy in sharing some of Haiti's most beautiful treasures with the children who need it most.

After a long rewarding week, Richard Copeland explained, "Organizations like **Hope for Haiti** are truly making a difference. They don't just work from the perimeter and give funds, but they are on the ground working with their hands and providing hope and love to the people."
