Staying in School: The Difference Hope for Haiti Makes



Three hours from the main town, on a bumpy, unpaved road that sneaks around a mountaintop, there sits a remote primary school. Meet 16-year-old Jolita Dema. Though Jolita wears a big smile, she is actually quite shy. Yet, she comes alive when she demonstrates how to play her favorite game, Oslet. Though Jolita is still a child, she understands the importance of school. She noted, "I like school because it prepares me for the future." She is in 6th grade and preparing to take the National Exam this month. If she passes, Jolita will be able to continue her studies. Looking towards the future, she hopes to study medicine, "I want to be a nurse when I grow up; I love it." Hope for Haiti makes sure that Jolita can stay in school by providing teacher salary subsidies and supporting the school with critical supplies as a part of its Back-to-School Fund public health curriculum.

For 25 years, Hope for Haiti has supported private primary and secondary schools throughout Southern Haiti to ensure that children have access to a quality education. Based on the idea that consistent and quality teaching is the key to a successful school and a vibrant community, we currently supplement teachers' salaries at 24 different schools. While subsidizing a community's ability to pay their teachers is our primary method of education support, we also provide assistance for back-to-school supplies and first-aid materials for use in our Public Health Program.
