When the Road is Gone, Hope for Haiti is There: How our Nutrition Program Makes a Difference

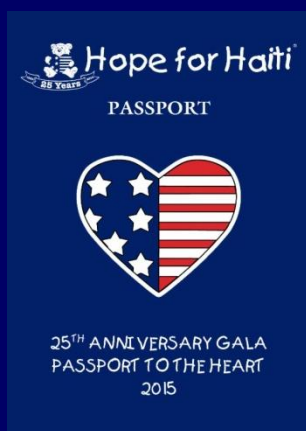


Four month old Madi, meaning "Tuesday" in Haitian Creole, has spent the last month in the children's malnutrition center at a small clinic in rural Haiti. Currently, there are two nurses that care for 12 babies that are fighting to get better in the center. During the rainy season, the road leading to the clinic is often washed out; meaning cars, taxis and motorcycles bringing nurses, doctors and of course medicines, can't reach it. For patients needing medical attention, especially these babies, immediate access to care and medications makes all the difference in the world. That's why Hope for Haiti's Nutrition Program helps to keep this clinic's depot stocked with medications, vitamins, and medical supplies, so that even when there is rain, there is still HOPE.

Through skilled partners in our healthcare and nutrition network, we combat malnutrition for babies like Madi through local institutions that
