Each year, Hope for Haiti's Reforestation program distributes over 2,000 seedlings to two rural school communities. With a team of 10 farmers working year round, the seedlings range from citrus fruit trees like mango and orange, to the super food moringa – a plant that grows freely in Haiti. Only about 2% of Haiti's forest remains due to severe deforestation, a reality that should not be ignored. "Whenever you are standing under a tree, you feel that there is life," notes Evoix, one of our long time farmers. Working with farmers and educating children on the importance of reforestation today is a way to ensure the life of Haiti's landscape tomorrow.

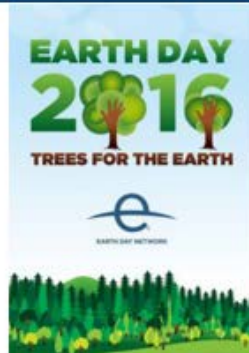
