It has been a week since the eye of Hurricane Matthew swept through the Greater South of Haiti as a Category 4 storm. The current death toll in Haiti is 900 and rising, with the threat of another humanitarian crisis arising from the spread of cholera, other secondary infections, and extreme dehydration from lack of clean water. The Haitian Government and United Nations officials estimate that some 350,000 people need immediate assistance.

In any disaster, children are always the most vulnerable. With schools closed, children are left home with their families to help try and rebuild their lives. Many children are getting sick and there have been several cases of children with cholera as clean drinking water is scarce. Now that the wind and flooding has subsided, children are at risk of being injured by the magnitude of debris that surrounds their homes and communities.

Our Haiti Office Administrator, Jessica Ciccarello, lives full time in Les Cayes and experienced the wrath of Hurricane Matthew first-hand. Watch her update from the field and hear why your support is desperately needed.
