CEO Letter

Dear Hope for Haiti Family:

I begin this letter with a deep sense of gratitude and pride about Hope for Haiti that has only grown stronger over the course of Fiscal Year 2017. Throughout a period of significant geopolitical, economic, and environmental challenges, our team has never wavered in our dedication to helping improve the quality of life for the Haitian people, particularly children.

In Fiscal Year 2017, Hurricane Matthew decimated homes, roads, schools, crops, and livelihoods in southern Haiti, yet Hope for Haiti was able to respond with strategic programmatic investments because of YOU. We did this by relying on the guidance and passion of a diverse and talented Board of Directors and staff, and by remaining true to our proven framework for sustainable communities. In addition, we engaged with critical partners to improve systems of education, healthcare, infrastructure, access to drinking water, and provide economic opportunity.

The theme of this year's annual report is "The Power of Partnership." We chose this theme to illustrate how we joined together with the Haitian people, the Haitian government, our partner communities, other non-profit organizations and you, our loyal donors and amazing volunteers. Each partnership makes our organization stronger and our collective impact much greater."

The evidence of the power of partnership in our work is significant. In 2017, Hope for Haiti supported 378 teachers and 7,313 students by partnering with the leaders of 24 communities to improve teacher training, teacher performance, and student achievement. We partnered with healthcare organizations like MAP International, who donated more than \$15 million worth of valuable medication to help us treat more than 13,000 patients at our Haitian-staffed Infirmary. Through a partnership with the non-profit organization Waves For Water, we distributed more than 1,800 home water filtration systems to families living in rural areas, enabling them to have personal access to thousands of gallons of clean water each year. With the generous support of U.S.-based company Bridger Steel, we were able to import and begin the distribution of more than 9,000 donated metal roof panels to help people rebuild their homes and schools following Hurricane Mathew. To support the economy and recovery of the environment, we worked together with local agronomists and individual households to plant thousands of fruit-bearing tree seedlings.



Contained in this report, you will find more examples of how partnership plays an important role in much of what we do and accomplish at Hope for Haiti. Each partnership is founded on trust, similar core values, transparency, and an overlapping belief that there is always a pathway to a better life in Haiti despite the challenges.

We are grateful for your partnership, and we look forward to working in solidarity with you and the Haitian people in the years to come.

IMPACT Story

Azor Rose-Marie Menard has lived in the community of Tête Source for 17 years. She moved to the community when she married her husband. All four of their children receive an education at Hope for Haiti partner schools. The two oldest attend Ravine Sable, which offers secondary school, while their younger siblings attend Tête Source located right in their community. Azor is very grateful for the support of Hope for Haiti because her children are getting a great education without having to walk for more than an hour to get to school in a nearby city. Azor benefits from working as a cook at the school in Tête Source, which means she earns additional income for her family. She also loves to teach embroidery and sells the items at market in Port au Prince. Azor's husband is a subsistence farmer, so having her income is critical, especially after the numerous rains they experienced this year.

Azor's family has been busy rebuilding their home after it was destroyed during Hurricane Matthew last October. In the interim, they have been living in small two-room structure that her husband repaired. To make matters worse, the family had to worry about safely accessing potable water when post-storm flooding caused run-off from the mountains. Azor tells us that her life changed for the better when Hope for Haiti distributed water filtration systems and conducted training in her community. Now, her children no longer have to travel far to get water and they can collect rain water to filter for cooking and drinking.






Thanks to Hope for Haiti's programs, her children are able to get an education, which will prepare them to get a job. They receive a nutritious lunch every school day, which was critical when her family's crops were destroyed. They have access to clean water, which reduces their chances of getting ill. Azor's hope for the future is to eventually see electricity in the community. "When you live here, you only have the moon to light the way so electricity is an important next step for us." Azor believes that Tête Source is a beautiful place to raise her children, and through partners like YOU she and her family can realize their full potential.




